The God who is there and here!

Have you ever been out on a clear night, observed the amazing array of stars in the sky and wondered "*Is there someone, something, out there? Someone bigger than us, a "god", creator, superior/supreme being?*" And *"If so, how could I know this God?" "How could I know that he/she/it is real?*" These are the fundamental questions of humanity; that innate sense of spirituality; that desire and longing to know, and connect with, the Ultimate Being beyond us.

The Bible talks about a unique Creator God who is there and is not silent, who has communicated to us and made Himself known to us - revelation. The people of the Bible encountered this God through God's self–disclosure in many ways: through the prophets (eg Moses), miraculous rescue (eg from Egypt), and in the giving of His Word (eg the Law). But in Exodus we read that God went a step further and set up camp in the midst of the people! The Tabernacle was literally a tent, a tent of meeting, the place where God dwelt with His people and they could "meet" with Him. It was a symbol of the presence of a God whom not even the biggest palace could contain, yet consented to be found in a tent. In Exodus 40 we read that the glory of the Lord filled the Tent of Meeting, and nobody could enter it because the glory of the Lord was too overwhelming!

So how does that help us meet with this overwhelming God? Thankfully, the Tabernacle was only a pre-cursor of a better encounter with the living God. God has provided a way in which we can not only know Him, but experience Him; not in a tent, but in our lives. Jesus is described as being "God-with-us". The Gospel writer John uses the word "tabernacle" to describe the man Jesus as the "*Eternal Word become flesh and dwelling (tenting) with us*", full of grace and truth. Jesus said that His followers would receive His Spirit, the Holy Spirit of God, who would be God living in us. We can not only know this God, but have Him dwell in us! He only awaits us to ask Him to come and take up residence! *Ian Weeks*

"You yourselves have seen what I did to Egypt, and how I carried you on eagles' wings and brought you to myself. Now if you obey me fully and keep my covenant, then out of all nations you will be my treasured possession. Although the whole earth is mine, you will be for me a kingdom of priests and a holy nation."

Exodus 19:4 - 6

Rescued to know God and make Him known! Knowing God = relationship with Him; meeting God face to face. Making Him known = being "priests" and a holy nation.

2. The Tabernacle – A Temporary Meeting Place Exodus 40

A dwelling place for God among His people Temporary – a tent Limited – the Curtain, the High Priest, the Day of Atonement. Inadequate – the Glory of the Lord too overwhelming.

3. The Temple – A Temporary Home King David asks to build a Temple – but God doesn't need one; God is more interested in relationship.

> God assents to David's request to build a Temple, but promises a greater dwelling place:

"I declare to you that the LORD will build a house for you: when your days are over and you go to be with your ancestors, I will raise up your offspring to succeed you, one of your own sons, and I will establish his kingdom. He is the one who will build a house for me, and I will establish his throne forever. I will be his father, and he will be my son. I will never take my love away from him, as I took it away from your predecessor. I will set him over my house and my kingdom for ever; his throne will be established forever." 1 Chronicles 17:10 - 14

> King Solomon builds the Temple - 2 Chronicles 3 – 7 Still Temporary, Limited & Inadequate.

4. Pentecost – God's Presence on earth Acts 2 & Ephesians 2 God now dwells not only with us, but within us! Permanent – never to leave us for eternity Unlimited – access to God for all believers 24/7 Adequate – the fullness of God dwelling in us by the Holy Spirit.
